Flooding in Southwestern PA

FEMA's Community Rating System (CRS) program is one way to help property owners reduce their flood insurance premiums.

The CRS was created in 1994 as part of the National Flood Insurance Reform Act, to reward communities with sound floodplain management practices with reductions in flood insurance premiums.

The three goals of the CRS program are to:

- Reduce flood damage to insurable property
- 2. Strengthen and support the insurance aspects of the NFIP
- 3. Encourage a comprehensive approach to floodplain management

It is a voluntary program, based on a point system – the higher the points, the lower the rating (Class 10 to Class 1). Each class offers different levels of flood insurance premium discounts, from 5% (Class 9) to 45% (Class 1), as shown in Figure 1.

Preferred risk policies are not eligable for CRS premium discounts because they already have premiums lower than other policies. Preferred risk policies are only available in B, C and X zones for properties that are shown to have minimal risk of flood damange.

Some minus-rated policies may not be eligable for CRS premuim discounts.

Premium discounts are subject to change.
